Hope everyone had a very Good Friday and a Happy Easter.

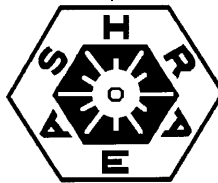

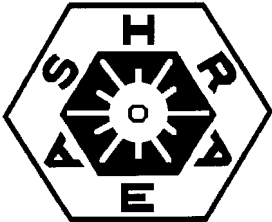
