PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

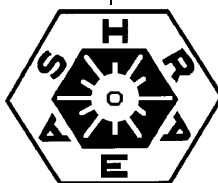

I dedicate this historical poem (vintage 1960) to my old slide rule (which I still have by the way.)

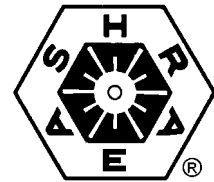
MY FRIEND

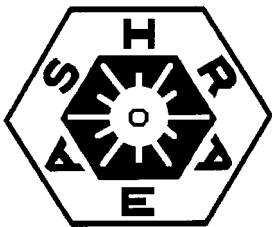
