PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

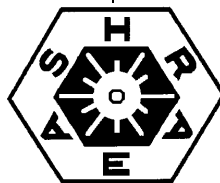

A BACKWARD GLANCE

This month’s column is dedicated to one of the distinguished architects from Shreveport’s past, Samuel G. Wiener. Sam Wiener was born in Monroe in 1896, but spent more than 70 years in Shreveport. He died in Shreveport in 1977 and more that a few of us remember him well. Even though it has been more than twenty years since Sam has been gone, the city of Shreveport still has examples of his work and creativity.

Architect Samuel G. Wiener’s work in Shreveport in the 1930’s helped introduce a bold new European-born design to America. It was this bold new type of building that helped make Sam rank as one of the most recognized architects to come from Northwest Louisiana.

While it is true that most of the buildings he designed were in a rather stark, unadorned, but functional International style and have since been torn down, those that still remain are noted for their functionality. The architectural community of today has noted that the very few that remain standing and unaltered- including his former home on Longleaf Drive in Shreveport- are considered to be priceless examples of modern-age architecture.

Wiener drew the most international acclaim for his design of the old three-story brick Municipal Incinerator on Kings Highway in Shreveport in that was erected in 1935. This building was razed in 1974.

Samuel Wiener was recently selected as one of the 100 most influential people of Northwest Louisiana.

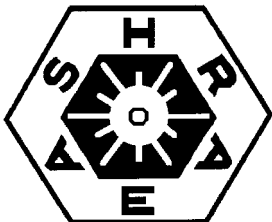
