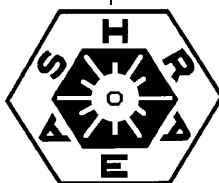
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

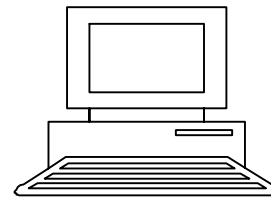

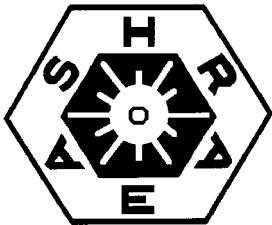
