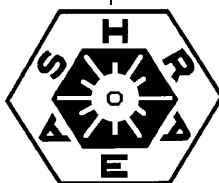
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

AUGUST 28, 2002**

1. Jeff Lutz called the meeting to order at 12 noon and asked for the committee reports.
2. Programs - John Watts - discussed planned program topics for 2002-2003 chapter year. September program will be a panel discussion on building design and construction coordination. Other program highlights: Region VIII DRC Hugh McMillan will visit at the November meeting; tour of the GM power plant scheduled for March meeting.
3. Treasurer - Gary Patrick - \$2700 in chapter account; there are outstanding fees from lunch meetings and golf tournament; \$500 will be used to establish the John Guth Scholarship.

7. 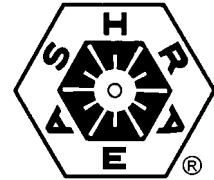

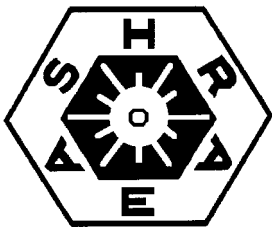
