Other professional experiences include serving as a Senior Consultant with Moran, Stahl & Boyer (MS&B), one of the nation's foremost corporate site selection firms; leading a local industrial development corporation in Oshkosh, WI; serving in staff marketing roles at the Fairfax County Economic Development Authority in Northern Virginia; and holding market research/liason positions with regional residential and retail real estate developers.

Having worked in various aspects of economic development since college, Mr. Foreman is fortunate to have helped lead three different organizations cited by *Site Selection* magazine as a top ten economic development group.

Mr. Foreman holds a bachelor of arts from Franklin & Marshall College in Lancaster, Pennsylvania and an MBA with distinction from the Babcock Graduate School of Management at Wake Forest University in Winston-Salem, NC. He is a member of the International Economic Development Council (IEDC), Louisiana Industrial Development Executives Association (LIDEA), and CORENET Global and the Industrial Asset Management Council (IAMC), both of which are associations for corporate real estate executives and related professionals.
